Dylan Roberts represents House District 26 in the Colorado House of Representatives, which encompasses Eagle and Routt Counties. Serving in this position since 2018, his work at the legislature has focused on lowering the cost of health care and prescription drugs, protecting our environment and water, finding ways to lower the cost of living, and promoting rural economic development. At the Capitol, he serves as the Chair of the House Business Affairs & Labor Committee and as a member of the House Judiciary Committee and the House Agriculture, Livestock & Water Committee. Dylan grew up in Routt County and now lives in Eagle County with his fiancé Sarah and their rescue-dog, Hattie.

Dylan is a third-generation Coloradan who was lucky to grow up in Routt County and now calls Eagle County home. Dylan and his family love taking advantage of everything that makes this part of our state so great like skiing, hiking, fishing, and enjoying the amazing outdoors. More importantly, Dylan and his family have grown up in and value the supportive and resilient communities, businesses, and individuals that call the mountains home and is so proud to represent them at the Capitol. Following law school at the University of Colorado, Dylan moved to Eagle County to begin serving as a Deputy District Attorney for Eagle County. In this position, Dylan fights for the victims of crime and pursues justice on behalf of the citizens of Eagle County. He has worked on cases across the Fifth Judicial District, encompassing Eagle, Summit, Lake, and Clear Creek Counties.

In 2018, the voters elected Dylan for a full two-year term with a margin of 60%-36% as the State Representative for House District 26, encompassing Eagle County and Routt County, in the Colorado House of Representatives. In 2020, he was elected to his second term, running unopposed.

During his time in the legislature, Dylan has quickly become one of the most effective, productive, and bipartisan legislators at the Capitol. He has served as the Chair of the House Rural Affairs & Agriculture Committee and is now the Chair of the House Business Affairs and a member of the House Agriculture, Livestock & Water Committee and the House Judiciary Committee. As of 2021, he has passed 70 bills that have been signed into law, 96% of them with bipartisan support. His legislation has focused on lowering the cost of health care and prescription drugs, protecting Colorado's environment and water, and promoting small business in rural Colorado.

Some of Dylan's key accomplishments at the legislature include: HB21-1232 – The Colorado Health Insurance Option which will provide a new, more affordable health insurance plan in every county of the state. HB19-1216 and HB21-1307 – A first in the nation bill to cap the cost of insulin that has now become a national model and an insulin affordability program for the uninsured and underinsured. SB19-004 – Legislation to remove regulations so that health care co-ops can operate in Colorado. HB20-1003 – A bill to continue and expand the Rural Jump-Start Small Business Program that helps businesses open in rural Colorado. SB21-291 – A bill that established the Economic Relief Cash Fund that will provide financial assistance to

businesses recovering from the COVID-19 pandemic. HB20-1157 – Legislation that expands the instream flow program that protects our rivers, outdoor recreation, and downstream agriculture during dry years.

As your State Representative, Dylan looks forward to continuing working to lower health care costs, combating climate change and protecting our lands and water, creating incentives for small business, and making our part of the state more affordable for hard-working families. In addition to his service at the legislature, Dylan is a board member of Water Education Colorado and a “Big Brother” mentor with Big Brothers Big Sisters Colorado. Dylan and his fiancé Sarah live in Avon with their rescue-dog Hattie.
